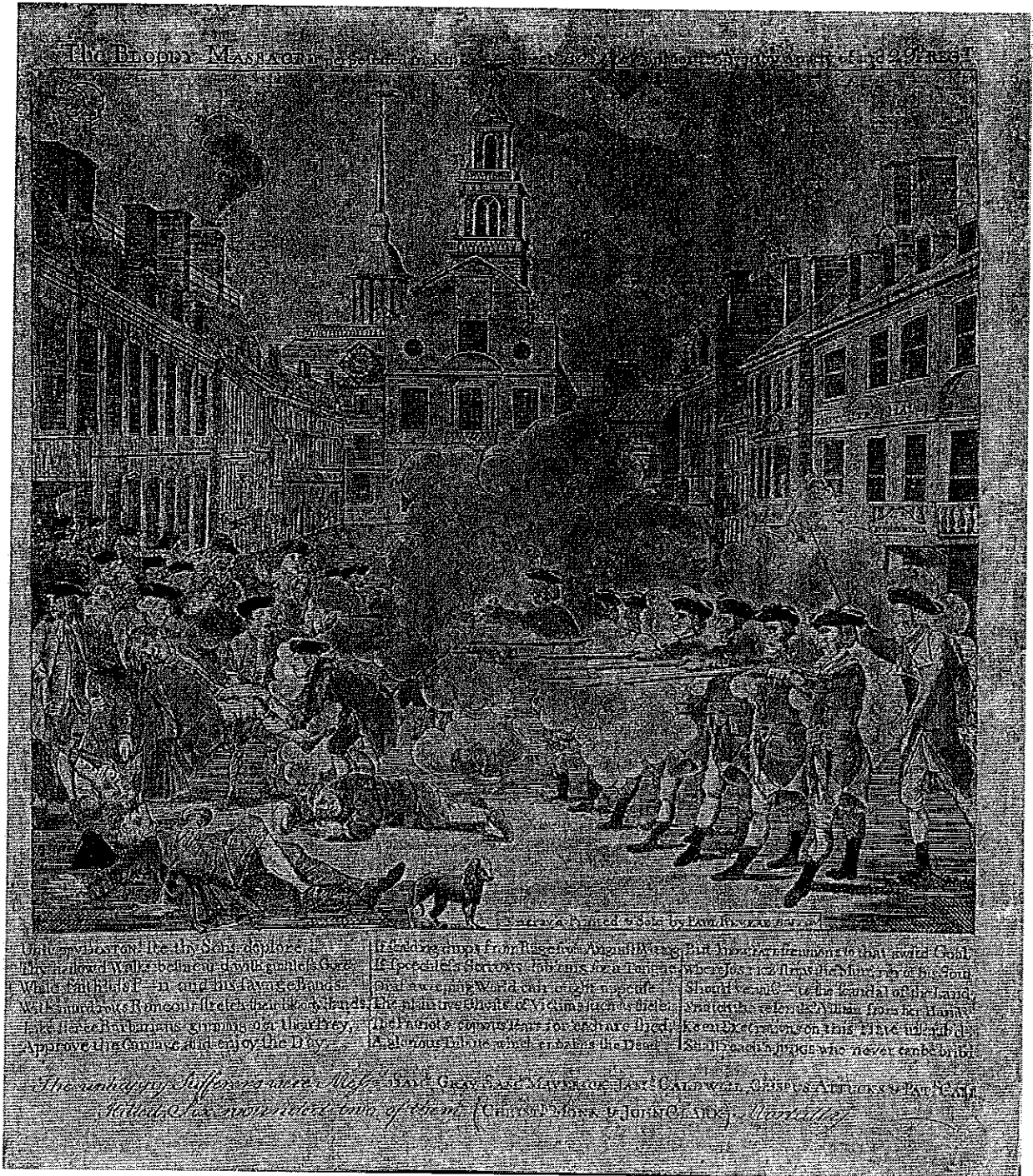


**Paul Revere Engraving—“The Bloody Massacre Perpetrated in King-Street . . .”**
